To apply for the scholarship:

- On a separate sheet please provide a Project Description setting forth the goals of your research and plans for achieving these goals. Please also provide a bibliography, and a Proposed Budget for your project. Please also provide a Curriculum Vitae with your application.
- Obtain one (1) Letter of Recommendation, specifically speaking to your commitment to Mount Athos or Mount Athos-related research.

Award Policies

The Grants Administration Committee will make recommendations to the Foundation’s Board of Directors for appropriate scholarship recipients. Upon approval by the Board of Directors, the Committee will send notifications of its decisions to all recipients.

Obligations of the Scholarship Recipient

Scholarship recipients are required to confirm acceptance of the scholarship via an Acceptance Letter provided by the Foundation. This must be done within thirty (30) days of award notification. If a recipient’s situation changes in the course of the scholarship application process so that the recipient is no longer qualified to accept the scholarship, the offer of Foundation scholarship support will terminate.

Publicity of the Scholarship(s)

The Foundation will publicize the Scholarship(s) in accordance with Foundation policies.
